As an apprentice, you will earn a wage alongside studying and gaining new knowledge and practical skills, you'll also be putting what you learn straight into practice.

What to Expect

An apprenticeship combines practical training in College alongside real world

experience. Apprentices at all levels will gain work experience, whilst earning a wage and gaining a qualification. What's more - there are no fees to pay when undertaking any level of apprenticeship. Apprentices develop specific skills that align with the needs of industry, making you an attractive candidate for future employers.

Top Tip

As an apprentice, you will be a valued employee. Take time to research and apply for job roles, as you will need an employment contract in place before your course starts.

Frequently Asked Questions

How long does an apprenticeship take?

A level 2 apprenticeship typically takes two years to complete and a level 3 an additional one or two years depending on the subject area. If you are studying a higher level apprenticeship, level 5 will normally take two or three years and level 6 an additional two years. Check the course descriptions on our website for the exact duration of the course you are interested in.

Can my employer be in the Republic of Ireland?

No. Your employer must be registered with HMRC and operate in Northern Ireland.

Do I have to pay fees?

There are no tuition fees for any level of apprenticeship or higher level apprenticeship.

What holidays/time off do I have?

Employers will determine and agree holidays with apprentices based on their terms of employment.

Will I have time off during Christmas/summer holidays when the College is closed?

While you'll have time off from class during Christmas, summer and other periods of student holiday, annual leave from your job will be determined directly with your employer.

How much will I get paid?

Your employer will decide on how much you get paid. The National Minimum Wage is a minimum amount that employees in the UK are entitled to be paid.

How do I find an employer?

You can search for apprenticeships on Job Apply NI, contact your local Jobs & Benefits Office, search through newspaper job listings, look for vacancies on employer or recruitment websites or call employers directly making them aware that you want to start an apprenticeship under the apprenticeship programme.

Entry Requirements

Level 2 and Level 3 Apprenticeships

Applicants must meet all of the following criteria:

- Have attained the upper limit of compulsory school age.
- Be either an existing employee in a new job role that requires a substantial amount of learning and skills development, or a new employee in (or about to take up) a permanent paid employment offer.
- Be employed by a company based in Northern Ireland and registered as an employer with HMRC.
- Be contracted to work a minimum of 21 hours per week (which includes day release/off-the-job directed training).
- Have the potential to successfully complete all the requirements of the appropriate apprenticeship.
- Meet any health requirements (e.g. colour vision, working at heights) specific to the occupation.
- Have achieved any necessary academic qualifications (e.g. GCSEs) determined by the relevant sector for the apprenticeship (see the SRC website for details).
- Pass any entry tests specified by the relevant sector/employer and approved by the Department for the Economy.
- Applicants to most level 3 apprenticeships will need to have successfully achieved a level 2 in a related area.



Higher Level Apprenticeships

The over-riding consideration in admitting applicants to a higher level apprenticeship (HLA) is evidence that the apprentice is able to complete the course.

Applicants must:

- Be at least 18 years of age on or before 1st July in the year of entry.
- Have obtained the minimum UCAS points for the required subject which range from 48 to 96 UCAS points. Please check the course details on our website for the required UCAS points for your subject. You may also need to have achieved a Level 3/A-Level grade in a particular subject area e.g. Science.
- Have attained at least 15 points at level 2 or above (e.g. GCSE) or have alternative approved qualifications. Please note that for some HLAs, a specific grade at GCSE may be required for Maths and English or other subjects.
- Provide evidence of competence in written and spoken English language.

Other Points to Note:

- Employers may further enhance the entry criteria at their discretion.
- All applicants for HLAs will be interviewed by prospective employers to decide their suitability prior to being employed.
- Each applicant must secure employment with a Northern Ireland based company with a minimum contract of 21 hours.


