The College's Higher Education (HE) GAA team are celebrating after a landmark achievement, winning the HE All Ireland GAA Final, their first since 2019 with a composed victory over Atlantic Technological University (ATU) Connemara.

After a cautious opening spell that saw ATU Connemara register an early 1-1, the SRC side responded with determination to draw the sides level and then forge ahead. This comfortable lead was swiftly tested by the ATU Connemara team, who

narrowed the gap, with the SRC team leading by the slimmest of margins at half time, 2-5 to 2-4. Following the break, the SRC team responded to this nail-biting pressure gaining momentum in the second half. The SRC side delivered an impressive

performance, with their defence strategy limiting the ATU Connemara side to three points. The final score on the sounding of the whistle, SRC 3-12, ATU Connemara 2-7.

Co-Team Manager and SRC staff member Rory McGreevy praised the team's performance, saying:

“This group showed outstanding character all season, but especially in the final. After going behind early, they trusted the work they’ve put in and delivered when it mattered most. To bring the title back for the first time since 2019 is a huge achievement for the players and for the College and we couldn’t be prouder of them and this result.”

Local Students Race to Global Stage with NI Championship Win in STEM Racing UK Finals

Six students from Southern Regional College have achieved outstanding success at the STEM Racing Car UK Finals, securing the Northern Ireland Champions National Cup and the opportunity to compete on the global stage this October at the Aramco STEM World Finals in Singapore, the weekend before the Formula One Singapore Grand Prix.

The UK Finals took place at the Magna Science Adventure Centre in Rotherham, England, from 24–26 March 2026, bringing together the top student engineering teams from across the UK.

The winning team comprises of students Chloe O'Hare, Sophie Houston, Ellie Magee, Harry Danks, Shea Smith and James McMullen. Each student took on specialist role within their racing team (SCAR), designing, building and racing a miniature Formula 1 car from concept to the racetrack.

Supporting these young champions, were sponsors Re-Gen, Used Cars NI, Murray Motorsport, The Exact Group, SMD Methods, MatLab, Ansys Simulation Software, Precision Mechanical Estimating, Southern Regional College and Stem Racing UK.

Leading the team and speaking on their success, engineering lecturer Seán MacDiarmada commented:

“The Champions of NI Cup is reflective of the effort students have put in, remaining to late hours in the College on a number of evenings to develop their entry. The qualification to compete in Singapore is a once in a lifetime opportunity, putting them

in the spotlight amongst the most promising young engineers in the world with Formula One team talent spotters scrutinising and judging their work. This puts them in poll position to be recruited into positions and careers that exist at the pinnacle of engineering.”

Estates Win Team of the Year 2026

The College’s Estates team have won the Workplace and Estates Team of the Year at the 2026 Facilities Management Awards. The team received their award on 11th March at the Radisson Blu, Royal Convention Centre, Dublin, ahead of a strong field of finalists, including major organisations such as PayPal, NIE Networks and Maynooth University.

Across the College network, the team manage 8 campus sites within the Armagh, Banbridge & Craigavon and Newry, Mourne & Down council areas. The team have worked tirelessly over the past year to deliver ambitious goals while operating

within challenging financial constraints.

The team have delivered excellence on scale. Managing an annual budget of £7.8 million and delivering services within 1% of the allocation, showing strong financial control and operating discipline. Their work also supports a large capital programme which includes the College’s flagship Newry Innovation Centre currently under construction.

The team have fully embraced sustainability and carbon reduction principles, introducing energy efficiency upgrades resulting in the 23% reduction of scope 1 emissions

from 2016/17 and launching a 10,500m2 rewilding programme to restore natural habitats, enhance biodiversity and healthier ecosystems.

Many of the teams’ achievements have been delivered without additional project funding, availing of in-house expertise. This includes the implementation of a ‘Caretaker Digital Logbook’, a mobile app to manage estate inspections and a ‘Digital Shadow’ project, a single user interface, providing meaningful analysis and insights for everyone across the estates team and external maintenance contractors.

Business Skills & Economic Development

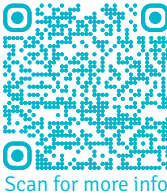

The College has strengthened its position as a people centred, high performing organisation after being awarded the We Invest in Wellbeing Standard Award for the first time and successfully retaining the We Invest in People Silver Award from Investors in People (IIP).

The College first achieved IIP recognition in 2012 and has sustained its accreditation across every review cycle since. For more than a decade the College has built on this success and used the Investors in People framework to guide continuous improvement in how staff are led, supported and developed.

The IIP framework requires organisations to develop strategies, take action and evaluate progress over a three-year period. Major initiatives undertaken since the last review include an upgrade of the staff health and wellbeing offering, which now includes free health checks and an electric vehicle scheme.

The Wellbeing Award, introduced by IIP in 2020, has also been secured by the College. This success reflects the strength of SRC's wellbeing culture and underlines the importance placed on staff health, engagement and work-life balance.

Looking ahead, SRC will continue its Investors in People journey by developing a new three year action plan that builds on recent

achievements while continuing to deliver an exceptional working environment for all staff.

Southern Regional College has partnered with the Southeast Higher Education/Further Education/Industry Cross-Border Alliance (SECBA) project. Supported by PEACEPLUS and managed by the Special EU Programmes Body (SEUPB), this landmark initiative brings together higher education, further education, and industry to address critical skills shortages across the south-east region of Northern Ireland and the border counties of Ireland.

Running until October 2028, the €9.7 million SECBA project will bridge the gap between education and employment, ensuring that learners gain industry-relevant skills while employers access a skilled and future-ready workforce.

The SECBA partnership which includes Dundalk Institute of Technology, Southern Regional College, Monaghan Institute, Cavan Institute, and Workplus has been established to meet the region's most urgent skills challenges.

Training will focus on three key sectors experiencing rapid growth and talent shortages:

- Software Development – enhancing digital skills in AI, machine learning, and cloud computing.
- Biopharmaceuticals – providing specialist biotechnology training across production processes.

- Business and Sports Management – developing essential leadership and management skills through workshops and training sessions, and sports analytics skills

“By working in partnership with DkIT, Monaghan Institute, Cavan Institute, and Workplus, SRC is building a cross-border workforce equipped for the future. The SECBA initiative represents a powerful example of how education and industry can come together to tackle regional challenges, close skills gaps and drive lasting prosperity for employers, learners, and communities alike.”

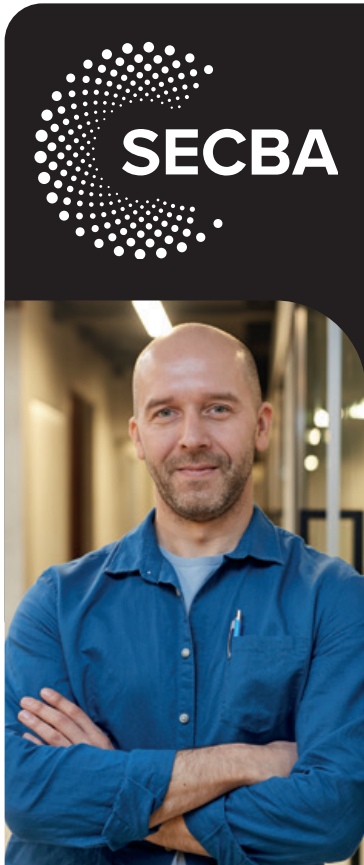

Eva received her medal from judge Sean Owens, IFEX Salon Culinare Director and WorldSkills UK Expert for Culinary Arts.

Students from Southern Regional College impressed judges at the recent IFEX competition held at the Eikon Exhibition Centre from 24–26 February 2026. IFEX is Northern Ireland's leading trade event for the food, drink, hospitality and retail industries. Alongside live demonstrations and product showcases, professional chefs and trainee chefs competed in a wide range of culinary competitions.

The students achieved outstanding results, bringing home bronze medals and certificates of merit across several categories. This year, judges placed strong emphasis on sustainability. Competitors were required to design seasonal menus using sustainably sourced ingredients. Marks were also awarded for minimising food waste. Judges carefully assessed how efficiently ingredients were used, ensuring dishes were realistic in cost and avoided unnecessary excess.

Southern Regional College Earns Silver Environmental Award

Southern Regional College has achieved a prestigious Silver award in the 2025 Northern Ireland Environmental Benchmarking Survey, led by Business in the Community Northern Ireland. This follows the College’s Bronze award in November 2024 and reflects a year on year improvement in environmental management, performance and the embedding of sustainability in strategy and operations.

Actions undertaken by the College since the last review include delivering substantial reductions in energy use, the investment of a £210,000 435 kW photovoltaic array at the Newry East campus and over £300,000 in LED lighting, low pressure hot water upgrades, building management system improvements and additional electric vehicle chargers.

The College’s sustainability agenda extends to social value, wellbeing and inclusion. Through the GoodforMEGoodforFE campaign, staff and students continued fundraising efforts for charity partner Alzheimer’s Society, volunteering hours for charity and community organisations and donating items, such as food, warm clothing and toys to local community organisations and foodbanks.

SRC Breaks Ground on £14.5m Newry Innovation Centre

Southern Regional College, together with officials from Department for the Economy, Felix O’Hare and Co. Limited and McAdam Design marked the official start of construction of the new £14.5 million Newry Innovation Centre with a sod cutting ceremony on Friday 15 May 2026.

The two-storey, 2,223m² building will be located on the former car park of the Newry East Campus on Patrick Street, previously known as the site of Newry Sports Centre. The development is set to deliver a modern, vibrant education facility designed to support teaching and learning across the wider community for years to come.

Felix O’Hare and Co. Limited, the appointed contractor, is leading the project and is expected to generate valuable employment opportunities for local people, including many Apprenticeship and Higher Level Apprenticeship roles.

Fully funded by the Department for the Economy, the Innovation Centre, designed by McAdam Design, plans to open its doors in September 2027. Once completed, it will include purpose-built project based learning areas, collaborative workspaces and breakout zones, all designed with a strong emphasis on sustainability and energy efficiency.

“I am pleased to be in Newry today to celebrate an important milestone for this project, which is being funded by the Department for the Economy. The construction of this new, state of the art campus will contribute to the Department’s economic priorities, creating valuable employment and apprenticeship opportunities. I look forward to seeing the project develop into a vibrant educational environment that will inspire many.”

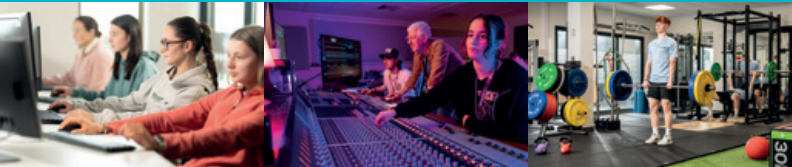

Other Funding

We want you to enjoy and make the most of your time at SRC. If your part-time course is accredited*, there are several funds available which you can apply to. These can help you pay for course fees, travel, books, childcare or living expenses.

1

Hardship Fund

To apply for the Hardship Fund, you must be 18 years or older and enrolled on a part-time accredited* course. The level of funding provided will be based on household income thresholds. Students on means tested benefits may be entitled to a repayment of the full course fees paid. Students with income below £33,950, may be entitled to a repayment of at least 50% of course fees paid. Application forms for the Hardship Fund will be available at campus receptions from the start of September 2026.

Further Education (FE) Grant

Students who are 19 years of age by 1st July 2026, who are on a low income or in receipt of a means tested benefit, can apply for a Further Education Grant to help pay for course fees. Courses eligible must be more than 8 hours per week or have a full-time equivalent programme. Students must also be progressing to a more advanced level of study. You may also receive a grant of £265 for books and equipment. This grant is means tested. Application forms are available from campus receptions or can be downloaded from www.eani.org.uk/fegrants. Please note the closing date for the FE Grant is the end of October 2026.

Student Loan Company: Higher Education Grant & Loan

a) Tuition Fee and Maintenance Grant

Higher Education students can apply for a means tested Maintenance Grant (non-repayable) up to £3,569 for a full-time student or up to £1,230 for a part-time student. Students who do not qualify for a full Tuition Fee Grant, can apply for the outstanding fee via the Tuition Fee Loan option.

b) Tuition Fee Loan

Students can also apply for Tuition and Maintenance Loans which are non-means tested but are repayable. The amount of loan varies; however, a full-time student can receive up to £4,985 per year. A part-time student can receive up to £3,641. Students who already hold a qualification which is equivalent or higher than the new qualification being undertaken will not be eligible for the undergraduate grant or loan. Students **MUST** apply online via the Education Authority website: www.studentfinancenl.co.uk.

*Accredited courses are those which carry a qualification. A recreational course is not an accredited course.

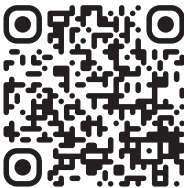
