#### **TERMS OF REFERENCE**

The Governing Body of Southern Regional College is responsible for securing the efficient and effective management of college activities and property. It is also responsible for the quality of service that the College offers to learners, communities and businesses as well as the Colleges financial health and strategic direction. The designated Accounting Officer role is held by the Principal/Chief Executive of the college. They are responsible for the propriety and regularity of the public finances of which the Accounting Officer is answerable.

The Governing Body is made up of a Chairperson and Vice Chair, the Principal and Chief Executive and currently 14 committee members which include two staff governors and a student governor.

The ToR can be summarised as follows:

In particular, the Governing Body is responsible for securing the efficient and effective management of College activities and property

- 1. The governing body provides strategic oversight, ensuring that the college's mission, vision, and strategic goals are aligned with its educational objectives and community needs.
- 2. Ensures fair employment practices, staff development, and a positive working environment.
- 3. The Governing Body must guide the strategy of the college in line with the priorities set by the Department and the NI Executive.
- 4. It must also review and approve local policies that fall within the remit of the Committee.
- 5. Follow a policy of openness and transparency.
- 6. Contribute to the maintenance or increasing of public confidence in the quality of the College's corporate governance and management.
- 7. Members should bring independence, objectivity, impartiality and expertise to both college decision making and challenge processes.
- 8. To maintain a high standard of governance in relation to public funds.
- 9. The governing body oversees the college's financial health, approves budgets, and ensures responsible financial management. It also monitors financial performance and compliance.
